

Educational Effectiveness

St. Charles Borromeo Seminary

- In 2016-17, 95% of students pursuing the B.S. degree achieved the learning goals set for them.
- In the same time period, 92.3% of the students in the Theology Division achieved the learning goals.
- The average grade for the summative exam:
 - For the M.A.P.S. degree (oral and written) was 89.9%
 - For the M.Div. degree (oral and exam) was 92.3%
 - For the M.A. degree Theology (oral and paper) was 95.15%.
 - For the M.A. degree School of Theological Studies, (oral and exam) was 93.2%
- 100% of the students in the Parish Leadership program at Villanova University found the program satisfactory or very satisfactory.
- 89.2% of the students in the Servant Leadership program at St. Joseph's University found the program relevant to their professional development.
- 90% of faculty rated the library as "excellent" in providing requested information in a timely manner.
- In rating the effectiveness of their Seminary education, College Alumni rated "understanding of their religious heritage" at 100%, and "development in apostolic formation" at 80%. Theology Alumni rated the same categories as 93.3% and 93.3%.
- In the Oral Communications course, students moved from an average of 3.0 per exercise to a 4.0 average per exercise over 4 years.
- 80% of College Alumni and Alumni thought their education prepared them very well or well for theological studies, their vocational choice or ministerial work.
- Of the Theology Seminary alumni, 100% felt that they were well prepared or prepared for ministerial work.
- Information Literacy students increased their skill level by 13%.
- 100% of the School of Theological Studies summer students would recommend the program to others.
