This four-session course will introduce the fundamental concepts and principles that govern Catholic moral theology. It will treat (1) the human person created in the divine image and destined for union with God and eternal happiness; (2) the dignity of the human person as the foundation for the Church's social justice teaching; (3) the human person as a sexual being called to live relationally and chastely as a visible witness of Christian love; and (4) contemporary moral and social issues surrounding life and death. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (2nd edition) is the basic text.
