

PRESENTATION OF THE 2023 CARDINAL FOLEY AWARD

At this, the eighth annual symposium to celebrate World Communications Day, it gives me great pleasure, in the name of Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary, to present this award in the name of an alumnus and former faculty member: CARDINAL JOHN PATRICK FOLEY.

In his work here in Philadelphia and at the Vatican, Cardinal Foley worked tirelessly to strengthen the Church's place and enhance its work in the realm of global communications. By all accounts, he was universally respected as much for his journalistic sensibility as for his clerical responsibility.



The annual celebration of World Communications Day focuses on that work, in which many of share directly. In his <u>message for this year's celebration</u>, POPE FRANCIS exhorts us to speak with the heart in all our communications, in contrast to a world "inclined towards indifference and indignation."



Communicating in this way was the forte of Cardinal Foley.

Archbishop Claudio Maria Celli, the cardinal's immediate successor at the Pontifical Council for Social Communications, spoke of this in a homily a month after his predecessor's death.

Cardinal Foley, he said, made it possible "to see the face of a church capable of speaking to the world with cordialness and to dialogue with it in maximum openness, without ever putting aside the truth or its own reasons."

He added that Cardinal Foley "had the tone of one who ... did not see enemies or adversaries, but (people) before whom he could make transparent, by way of a friendly welcome, the benevolence of the Lord."

As for the journalist whom we honor today ... well, we don't often get to hear her tone since her work is mostly written! But, like the cardinal before her, she has certainly helped the English-speaking world to see the face of the Catholic Church and, in particular, of the popes that lead it.







As a journalist, she has covered the Vatican since 1989, and her four decades worth of stories have been published in every major Catholic news outlet.

She has also travelled the world with the current pope, as well as his two predecessors. From her seat in the front row of the press cabin, she frequently participates in the papal press conferences.



From that experience, she has gained a unique perspective on Catholicism as a global enterprise – a view she has shared with us in two books about Pope Francis: one describing the Holy Father as "A Guide in God's Time"; the other offering a Lexicon of his quite unique, often homespun, and always intriguing vocabulary.
